Pupils are happy at school. The school is a safe environment that fosters a passion for learning alongside pupils' personal development. Pupils experience a culture of equality and inclusion embedded in all aspects of their life in the school, regardless of their ability and personal circumstances, and are valued as part of a community rooted in the love of God and others.

There is a broad, balanced and ambitious curriculum which meets all statutory requirements, maintains an Outstanding rating, and is enhanced by Butterfly Moments and extra-curricular activities; the curriculum is the best it can be for its pupils within the funding available, clearly addressing the learning gaps as a result of the pandemic, and building on prior knowledge and skills.

There is a clear universal offer and targeted support for all children, with early identification of special educational needs and child-specific intervention, with continuous monitoring and review as a child progresses through the school. The SEND strategy is responsive to local health and educational changes as a result of the Government paper: Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Alternative Provision (AP) Improvement Plan Right Support, Right Place, Right Time.

There is an evidence based approach to spending, particularly for pupil premium & catch up funding, with impact analysis and review of investments, and evidence of using all future funding streams to the best advantage of the school as a whole.

Staff benefit from investment in the quality of their teaching through robust CPD for all staff, including subject-focused teaching, pedagogy, and leadership and management development, aligned to the School Improvement Plan and as part of long term workforce planning.
