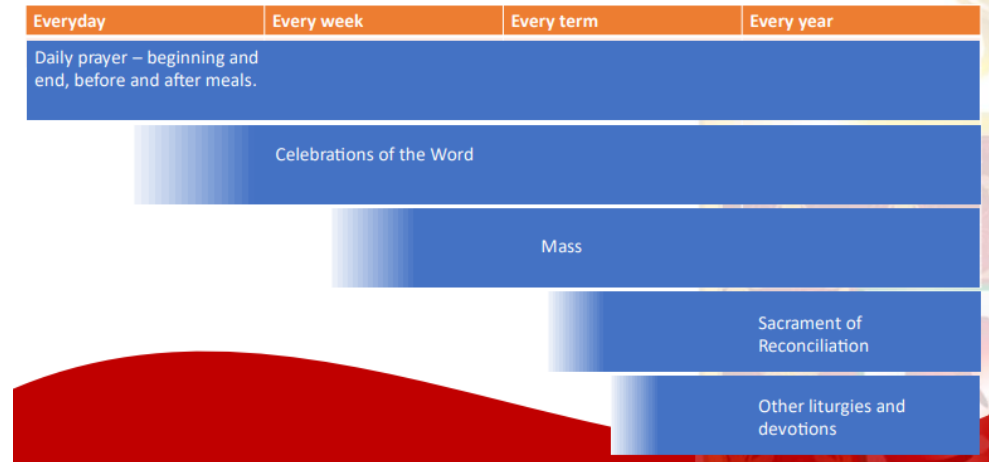

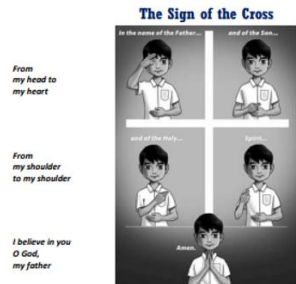

We make this sign for two main reasons.

1. We want to make the sign of Jesus' Cross over us. This shows us that He loved us so much by dying on the Cross for us.
When Jesus died on the Cross, He took all our sins on Him.
Through Jesus' death on the Cross, we have our sins forgiven.
2. We bless ourselves in the name of the Trinity:
 - God the Father who created;
 - God the Son who came as a human being to die on the Cross for us;
 - God the Holy Spirit whose presence and power lives in us.

We shouldn't be careless when we make this special sign on ourselves.

We should think about God's love for us.

We should remember that God is within us – that He is always with us.
